

TALLASSEE MUNICIPAL GAS SYSTEM "NOTICE"

WHAT TO DO IF YOU SMELL GAS

That distinctive odor is the harmless chemical we add to natural gas so you can detect even the smallest amount that might escape. **It smells bad... but that's good!** Natural gas has no odor on its own. Everyone should be able to recognize our built-in system safety signal. If you ever detect faint whiffs of this odor, **INVESTIGATE**. If possible "follow your nose" to the source. It may be only a pilot light that's out, or a burner valve partially turned on. Something easily and safely corrected. If the source of this gas cannot be located or the odor persists, call Tallassee City Hall, 283-4298, during normal hours (7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.) Monday through Friday. At night or on weekends or for any emergency reporting of gas line breaks, call Tallassee Police Department **283-6586**. Please give adequate directions as to the location of the leak.
